Clinic treats many

Yezezi is one of the most deprived villages in Ghana. Four hundred patients are treated at this 3-year-old clinic every month. Most patients are treated for malaria, skin infections, anemia, diarrhea or pneumonia.

Many are also treated for Cerebro spinal meningitis, a deadly disease that attacks during the hot season. This clinic serves many neighboring villages.

Prudence Kpesie is the midwife in charge of the clinic. She is married and has three children. She considers it her Christian duty to

leave the relative comforts of the city to serve in this remote and deprived area of the country.

Her vision is to reach out to the

nearby communities with health education and treatment. With no vehicles in this community, her reach is severely limited.

Student writes of Ghana trip

Matthew Herron, student at the Medical College of Ohio, recently returned from a seven-week trip to Ghana.

He writes, "Most of the time was spent in the heavily Muslim Northern Region. Three weeks were spent preaching the Good News of Jesus Christ to an impoverished, yet beautiful, people.

"Many heard that Jesus is the Messiah, believed in Him as their only Savior, confessed their sins to God, repented of their previous lifestyles and were immersed in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of their sins and the gift of the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:38).
