

2018 END OF THE YEAR REPORT FOR GHANA CHRISTIAN MISSION

Progress and accomplishments for 2018

The accomplishments will be listed in the four areas of our mission:

Church Planting:

We made six field trips to the church planters. During the visits, seminars were held to revive the commitment of the church planters and their leaders as well as introduce to them new /modern methods of reaching out with the Gospel (Discovery Bible Study).

420 new souls we baptized.



15 new churches were started.

10 *dead* churches were revived.

The Chakali project was successfully started and is still on going.

Six students under our sponsorship graduated last year and six more are yet to complete.

Four churches received various levels of assistance to continue their building projects.



Medical Outreach:

Two medical short-term outreaches were held in July-August and September by Global Health Outreach and Bringing Good News International. A total of about 5000 people received treatment. Free toothbrushes, sunglasses and soaps were distributed alongside.

Our clinics saw a total of 37,008 patients with 811 babies delivered. We believed that without our presence in those communities many of these patients would have lost their lives.

Christian Education:

Through Dr Jodie Ferise's team (University of Indianapolis), Transformational Basic School received a grant to build 4 classrooms.

Several trainings and seminars have been held in the churches as part of Christian education to assist them to deal with some of the issues confronting them.

Community Development:

In addition to providing educational support for some selected students, we have also partnered with Mission Resource Ghana to provide low interest loan to some people either to boost their small businesses or to start a new one. This includes farming, fishing, trading amongst others.

Three used vehicles have been purchased to enhance field operations and supervision.

We give all glory to God for all he has helped us to accomplish.



Special needs for the ministry

Replace 5 worn out motorcycles for pastors and evangelists (\$3,000 for each one).

Recruitment and funding a U.S.A Director of Mission Development (more details from Indiana office).

Providing clean drinking water for five villages at the cost of \$5000 a well.

Completing a baby delivery center at the Makango Clinic at the cost of \$60,000.

Short Term and Long-Term Goals for 2019

Our mission specializes in four areas. Therefore, the goals will be categories in these four areas.

Church Planting:

Discipleship and souls wining: our primary in church planting to the win souls and disciple them. We have therefore as goals to equip the pastors through field visitations, seminars and retreats so they can win more souls for the Lord. We intend to provide more tools and resources such as projectors, tracts, gaming tools (balls, nets, ropes, cards,) in Evangelism, Crusade, film shows, children ministry We pray for 1000 souls to be won by the end of the year

Many of the pastors in the Rural areas depend on motorcycles that are about 10 years old. Our goal is to provide new motorcycles for these pastors as well as new ones for those that are being trained.

Rural Churches: Many of the rural churches still meet under trees or in classrooms. Some have tried raising some structures but these were brought down by rain and wind storms. Our goal this year is to raise a matching-fund to support any of them who are ready to build or rebuild.

Provide Biblical/theological training to as many as 10 people who are ready to serve the Lord as “the field are blooming with few laborers.”

Chakali: There is an ongoing work among the Chakali people group in Upper West Region of Ghana. Presently, we have reached the stage of making the floor, plastering and furnishing the house that is being built for the church planters. Our goal is to complete this house, provide water and electricity for that the work can fully begin.

Start preliminary work to begin work in new terrain (start work with new one of the 17 unreached people’s group in Ghana)

To hold two seminars in the history and values of the Restoration Movement to instill deep values of biblical non-denominational Christianity among GCM staff and other church leaders.

Medical Outreach:

Our Medical Outreach department has two main parts. The short-term medical missions and the seven (7) rural clinics that continue to provide healthcare for people in rural and remote areas.

For the short-term medical outreach events, which each last 4 to 6 days, we wish to hold two this year as we collaborate with Global Health Outreach and Bringing Good News International.

Our focus for the seven (7) clinics we operate, is to develop a continuous supply of medicines, because the national health insurance scheme still struggles to pay claims for the medicines to be replaced.

To collaborate with organizations such as Project CURE to provide medical equipment and replace those that are out of use.

Christian Education:

We presently have two schools that we partner with: Faithway Christian Academy and Transformational Basic School. We plan to adopt a school started by our church planter in Keri in the northern part of the Volta Region. The school still meets under a straw shed. Our goal is to raise support and partners to build the school up and provide educational materials.

Community Development:

Our goal is to provide four boreholes to four community facing water crisis.

Provide educational support/sponsorship/scholarship to needy children and individuals.

Continue the school feeding program in four rural public schools in Ghana with the donated fortified rice from Feed My Starving Children.
